The Anchor Plan is required for all Hope College students and represents the general education liberal arts program. The following chart explains these requirements.

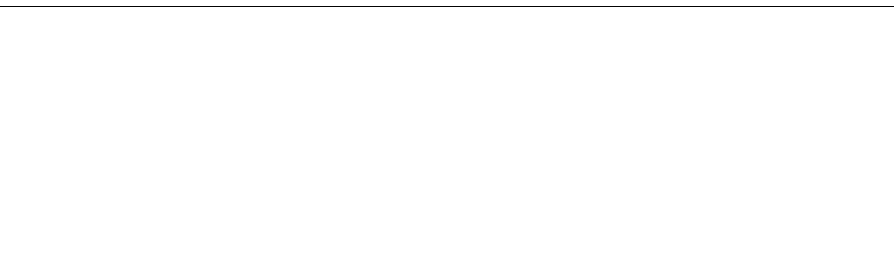
